

Provisional Camping: Scouts who cannot attend camp with their own unit or want to attend another or different session are encouraged to attend provisionally. Scouts will be placed with another unit for the camp. The summer camp will have a special provisional troop if needed. For more information about provisional camping, contact the camp director or the leader of a unit that will be in camp during the week of choice.

Complaints-Concerns-Suggestions: The Camp Arrowhead administration maintains an *open-door policy*. Please follow proper channel, and address *all* complaints, concerns and suggestions to the Camp Director, Program Director, Business Director or Camp Commissioner. Please do not issue complaints directly to any other staff member. It is the duty of the camp administration to manage the staff and the camp. Complaints, concerns and suggestions are most effective when fresh, so please do not let them fester. *We will do our best to make your stay with us fun and exciting – even beyond your expectations.*

Campsite Reservations for Future Years: Units have the opportunity to reserve a site for the next year while at camp. Units may reserve the same campsite during the same session next year by filling out a reservation form and paying the \$100 deposit per campsite to the camp business office. The unit also has the option of waiting until September 1st 2007 to reserve a different site on a first come, first-served basis. Deposits are required at the time of the reservation and are used as part to the camp fee. *The Camp Director reserves the right to combine or move units from campsites to accommodate the needs of the camp.*

Security: Any suspicious individual, group or vehicle should be reported immediately to the Camp Director for resolution. Campers, leaders and staff are asked not to leave the camp property. When exploring remote areas of camp, always have a buddy. Do not enter other campsites without permission.

Family Night at Camp Arrowhead: Family Night at camp is dedicated to visiting with family and friends in the wonderful setting of Camp Arrowhead. Note: Visitors and families will need to bring their own meal and eat it in the unit campsite or other picnic areas. The Family Night Campfire will begin at 8:30pm and concludes about 10:00pm. Family camping is available behind Foster Lodge. *Scouts must remain for a minimum of 5 days & nights to qualify for a long-term camping credit.*

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Medical Lodge: The Medical Lodge is located in Arrowhead Lodge on the west side of the main parking lot and handles minor accidents and illnesses. Special arrangements for the treatment of more serious cases have been made with local facilities. All medical emergencies must be reported to the Health Officer immediately for treatment and documentation. Emergency service is available 24 hours a day. *Medication should never be administered by anyone other than the Health Officer or campers own parent.*
